

Breast Cancer Awareness Campaigns by Women Voices

Women Voices ran an online breast campaign for cancer awareness Pakistani womens. Breast cancer is a significant health issue worldwide, and Pakistan is no exception. With over 90,000 new cases reported annually and around 40,000 deaths each year, breast cancer is the most common cancer among women in Pakistan1. Humanity in Voices ran an online campaign aimed to highlight the importance of early detection and regular check-ups to combat this disease effectively. One in every nine women in Pakistan is at risk of developing breast cancer in her lifetime. Approximately 109 women die every day due to breast cancer in



Pakistan. Early detection of breast cancer significantly increases the chances of

successful treatment. When breast cancer is detected early, the five-year relative survival rate is nearly 100%. Early detection methods include breast self-exams: Women should perform monthly self-exams to detect any unusual changes, clinical breast exams: regular check-ups with healthcare professionals can help identify abnormalities that may not be noticeable through self-exams. Raising awareness about breast cancer in Pakistan is crucial. By promoting early detection, regular check-ups, and overcoming cultural barriers, we can improve survival rates and provide better support for those affected by this disease. Every woman deserves the chance to live a healthy, cancer-free life.

skills, strengthening our resolve to make a meaningful impact.




